Effective Date: 5th August 2026

Company: ImmunoSig Ltd. (company number 16642090), a company incorporated in England and Wales, with its registered office at 86-90 Paul Street, London, EC2A 4NE (“Company,” “we,” “our,” or “us”).

We value your privacy and are committed to protecting personal data in compliance with applicable laws, including the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR) and the Data Protection Act 2018.

1. What this notice covers

This Privacy Notice explains how we collect, use, store and share personal data when you:

- visit www.immunosig.com or related ImmunoSig webpages;
- submit an enquiry through our website;
- contact us by email or another communication channel; or
- discuss a potential business relationship or project with us.

Project, research or clinical data supplied under a client contract may be governed by separate contractual terms, including our **Master Service Agreement** and any applicable **Data Processing Schedule**.

2. Personal data we collect

We may collect the following information.

Information you provide to us

This may include:

- your name;
- email address;
- telephone number;
- job title;
- organisation;
- information contained in an enquiry or message;
- details about a potential project, service requirement or business relationship; and
- any other information you choose to provide.

Please do not submit patient-identifiable information, health data, research-participant information or other special-category personal data through our public website forms. Project data should only be transferred through a secure process agreed with ImmunoSig.

Technical and website information

When you use our website, we may process limited technical information such as:

- browser and device type;
- operating system;
- referring website or campaign;
- pages visited;
- approximate geographic location;
- date and time of access; and
- website interaction information.

Google Analytics information is collected only where you have accepted analytics through our cookie banner.

3. How we use this data

We use personal data for the following purposes.

Responding to enquiries

We use your information to respond to questions, provide requested information and discuss potential projects or services.

Our lawful basis is normally our legitimate interest in responding to business enquiries and developing business relationships. Where you ask us to take steps before entering into a contract, the processing may also be necessary for pre-contractual purposes.

Providing services and managing client relationships

Where you become a client or business partner, we may use your information to:

- prepare proposals and contracts;
- deliver agreed services;
- communicate about projects;
- maintain business and financial records; and
- manage our contractual relationship.

Our lawful basis may be performance of a contract, taking steps before entering into a contract, compliance with legal obligations or our legitimate business interests.

Website security and operation

We may process technical information to maintain the security, availability and performance of our website.

Our lawful basis is our legitimate interest in operating a secure and reliable website.

Website analytics

Where you accept analytics, we use Google Analytics 4 to understand how visitors find and use our website, assess the effectiveness of our content and improve website performance.

Our lawful basis is your consent. You may refuse or withdraw analytics consent at any time using the cookie-management button on the website.

Legal and regulatory purposes

We may process personal data to:

- comply with legal or regulatory requirements;
- respond to lawful requests from public authorities;
- establish, exercise or defend legal claims; or
- prevent or investigate fraud, misuse or security incidents.

Our lawful basis may be compliance with a legal obligation or our legitimate interests.

4. Cookies and analytics

Our website uses essential cookies to operate, and optional cookies (Google Analytics) with your consent.

You can manage or withdraw consent at any time using the “Manage Cookies” icon or your browser settings.

5. Sharing and storage

We only share limited information with trusted service providers (e.g., web hosting, analytics).

All third parties follow strict confidentiality and security measures.

Where we store and transfer data

We use reputable service providers for hosting, DNS, and analytics. As a result, your information may be processed in the UK, the EEA, the United States, or other countries where these providers operate.

When personal data is transferred outside the UK/EEA, we rely on appropriate safeguards, such as:

- the UK's adequacy regulations (including the UK-US Data Bridge where applicable), and/or
- the UK Addendum to the EU Standard Contractual Clauses (SCCs).

We also apply technical and organisational measures (such as encryption and access controls) to protect your data.

Our key service providers

- Carrd, Inc. hosts and delivers the ImmunoSig website content.
- Namecheap, Inc. manages our domain and Cloudflare, Inc. our DNS (no tracking or analytics data).
- Google LLC (Google Analytics 4) provides optional, consent-based anonymous analytics.

Analytics only operates if you accept cookies via the banner.

6. Data retention

- Enquiry emails: kept for up to 12 months after our last correspondence, unless further communication is required.
- Cookie preferences: stored in your browser for 1 year (cookie_consent_v2).
- Analytics data:
 - Google Analytics cookies expire after approximately 13 months.
 - Event and user data within Google Analytics are retained for up to 14 months, as configured in our analytics settings.
- You can withdraw or change your consent for analytics at any time by selecting "Manage Cookies" or choosing "Disable analytics" on our website.

7. Your Rights (UK GDPR)

Under UK GDPR, you have the following rights regarding your personal data:

1. **Right of Access:** Request a copy of your personal data.
2. **Right to Rectification:** Correct inaccurate or incomplete data.

3. **Right to Erasure:** Request deletion of your personal data, subject to legal or contractual obligations.
4. **Right to Restrict Processing:** Limit processing under certain circumstances.
5. **Right to Data Portability:** Receive your personal data in a structured, commonly used format.
6. **Right to Object:** Object to processing for direct marketing or legitimate interests.
7. **Right to Withdraw Consent:** Where processing is based on consent, you can withdraw it at any time.
